9:00 to 10:00

See It Say It Spanish (Room 4) Good for any age, preferably old enough to sit and listen to instruction, so 1st or 2nd grade and older. No experience necessary. This class will focus on vocabulary building, daily expressions, and practicing conversation and songs in Spanish.

Literary Archetypes (Room 6). For junior and senior high and for those younger kids who really want to know what's going on besides the plot. This class will focus on fairy tales and fictional story telling.

Nature Books & Crafts (Room 8). This one will be for the little kids, pre-K and early grade school, but anyone can join! Story time will be followed by a craft that connects with the theme of the book.

10:00 to 11:00

Pre-K (Room 3). This one is also for the very young—no minimum age as long as a parent is with the child—and will follow a standard pre-k curriculum.

Art Techniques (Room 8). This class is for anyone who can sit and listen to instruction, but probably upper elementary through high school is ideal. Learning about and working with different art media like pastels, chalk, and various paints and papers will keep this one interesting.

Literature (Room 6). This will be good for upper elementary (say 3rd grade) and older. Our first book will be *The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe*. The book will be read out loud and discussed with some activities interspersed.

High School Physics w/Lab (Rooms 2 and 7). This class is recommended for juniors and seniors, but parents should use their own judgement about enrolling freshman and sophomores. Since it will only be taught once per week on Friday, students will be expected to do work at home independently. We'll be using Dr. J Wile's Physics (2nd edition) textbook, and families will be asked to provide their own or be willing to share.

11:00 to 12:00

Spanish for Native Speakers (Room 4). Anyone who already speaks fluent Spanish should take this class, which is a grammar/literacy class akin to English classes for native English speakers: writing, spelling, grammar.

3-Dimensional Art (Room 8). This class is open to all comers, but should be up to the parent to either stay with younger children to help keep them on task and to assist them as needed. Adults welcome to all art classes as well as our lovely teacher plans to work on some semester-long projects with a variety of sculpting techniques.

Homeschool 101 (Room 5). This class is for adults to come for support and advice on parenting and homeschooling questions. Janet Culloton will lead this discussion.
